



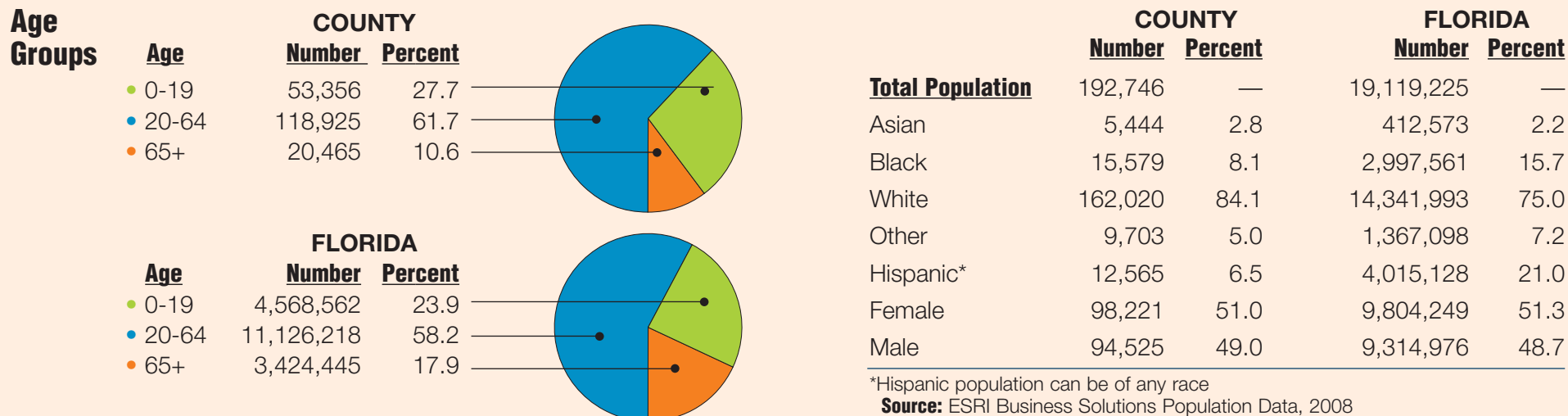
MISSION

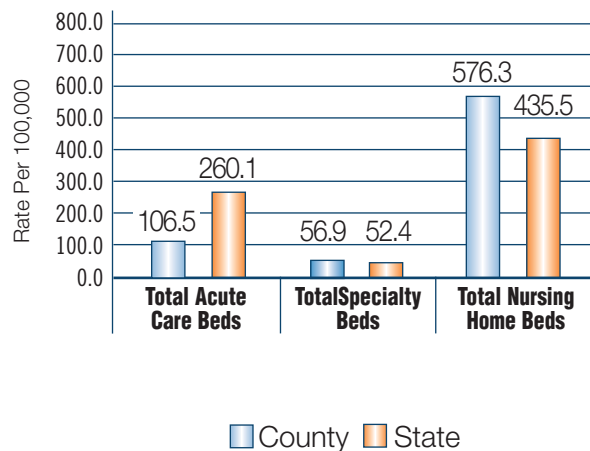
