

## HEALTH CARE UTILIZATION REPORTS

These reports show utilization characteristics for the health delivery system in this Region and when they are taken in their entirety, they present an accurate picture of the total delivery system and the relative role of each of the major players. All of these reports are ongoing and are published monthly, quarterly or semi-annually so that a reader of the reports gets a moving picture of who does what, and where the relative changes in position are taking place.

All reports created from the AHCA data are distributed a semi-annual basis. Separate reports are prepared for each market area within Region 4. The greater Jacksonville area (Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau, St. Johns Counties) and Flagler/Volusia County.

### **MEDICAL SERVICE BY HOSPITAL - AHCA hospital inpatient data files**

It provides a reference of patients by medical services by hospital. *All inpatient DRGs are linked to 28 medical service line items developed by the HPC data committee.*

### **PATIENT ORIGIN REPORT - AHCA hospital inpatient data files**

A three section report that examines inpatient discharges by zip codes. The first section shows the total number of patients from each zip code and what hospitals they went to. The second section shows what percent of all patients from each zip code used which particular hospital. The third section shows the percent of the hospitals total patient load that came from that particular zip code. *A very useful report used to determine hospital inpatient flow and access trends.*

### **PAYER SOURCE BY HOSPITAL - AHCA hospital inpatient data files**

This report shows the payer mix of each hospital. The data shows the number of patients and patient census days by pay source. It shows for example which hospital had the largest share of Medicare, CHAMPUS, Charity, HMO patients, etc. *There are currently 15 designated pay sources used in the inpatient data files.*

### **PAYER SOURCE BY ZIP CODES - AHCA hospital inpatient data files**

This report shows how patients from each of the various zip codes areas in the region paid their hospital bill. *The report is useful from the standpoint of showing, for example, where the aged live, HMO/PPO penetration areas, military (CHAMPUS) concentration, etc.*

### **EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT DATA – AHCA ED data files**

Inpatient and Outpatient reports by zip codes, pay source by hospital, top 10 principal diagnosis for inpatient and outpatients visits by age. *The hospital inpatient database combined with the outpatient ED database provides a complete picture of the hospital emergency departments.*

### **MONTHLY HOSPITAL PATIENT STATISTICS REPORT – Self Reported**

Reports total licensed hospital beds and opened beds for each regulated hospital bed; discharges, discharge days and patient days for acute care (medical/surgical, obstetrics and pediatric), neonatal ICU, mental health, long term acute care, and comprehensive medical rehabilitation. Other miscellaneous information includes live births, transplants, open heart surgery, cardiac cath and inpatient/outpatient surgery.

### **MONTHLY EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT REPORT – Self Reported**

Reports the number hospital ED visits, admissions, arrivals by rescue/ambulance.

*The value of these two monthly reports is that the reader can get a quick, clear and concise monthly picture of the hospital industry in the region from the standpoint of size and extent of utilization among the various services.*

### **NURSING HOME QUARTERLY CENSUS REPORT – Self Reported**

The report records the number of total licensed beds for each nursing facility by county, sub districts and region. The report has monthly Medicaid, Medicare and total census days, overall occupancy rates with quarterly Medicaid rate. Other miscellaneous information includes private pay daily room rates and percent of residents with Alzheimer's and or Dementia other than Alzheimer's.

*The significance of the report is a precise overview of the nursing home industry with Region 4 from a viewpoint of facility size and utilization. Nursing Home Administrators find this report very helpful and informative.* AHCA repealed Hospital Based Skilled Nursing Unit rule July 19, 2005. There is a moratorium on new community beds until July 1, 2011.
