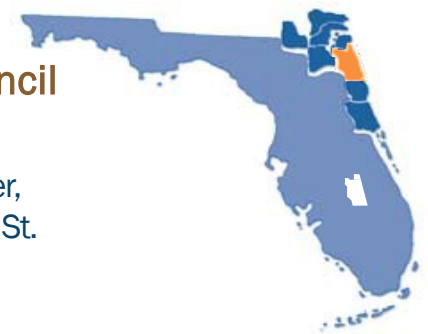

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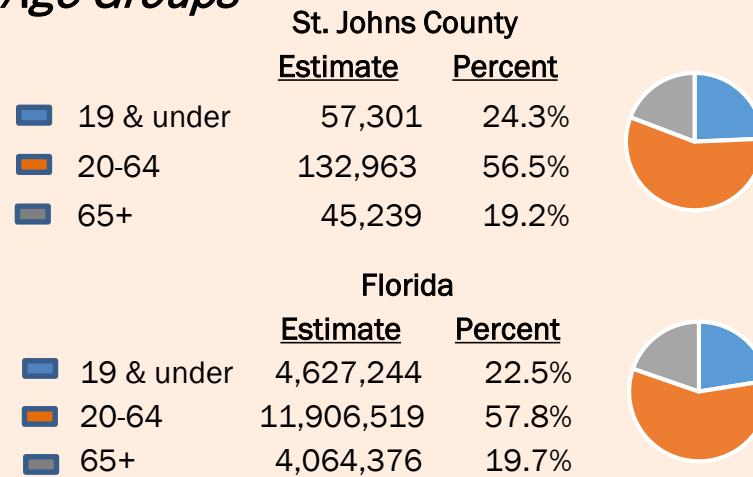


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## Demographics, 2014-18

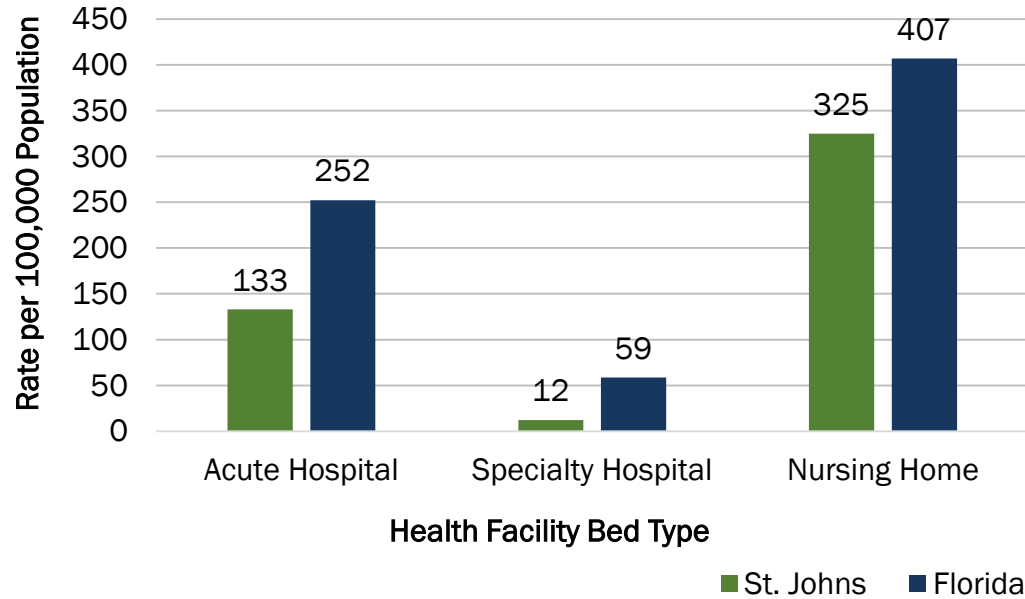
